

List of general use fungicides for common grape diseases for backyard gardeners

Examples of product name (updated 9/20/21, Names in bold are confirmed their availability as of 2021)

- Bordeaux mixture: Gordon’s (Acme) Bordeaux Mixture, Dragon Bordeaux Mix (For most of the purpose, you can use copper instead of Bordeaux mixture.)
 - Captan: **Bonide Captan 50% WP (do not mix with oil!!)**, **Gordon’s Liquid Fruit Tree Spray (note: it includes insecticide, do not mix with oil!)**
 - Liquid copper: **Bonide Liquid Copper Fungicide**, **Monterey Liqui-Cop**, **Natural Guard Copper Soap (note: some varieties are sensitive to copper)**
 - Ferbam: Dragon Ferbam Wettable Fungicide
 - Lime sulfur: **Bonide Lime Sulfur Spray**, **Hi-Yield Improved Lime Sulfur Spray**
 - Mancozeb: **Bonide Mancozeb Flowable with Zinc**
 - Myclobutanil: **Spectracide Immunox** (not Immunox plus which has an insecticide)
 - Neem oil, and other oil products: **Organic lab. Organocide (soybean oil)**, **Green Light organic fungicide (Rosemary Oil)**, **Monterey Neem oil 70% (note: do not mix with sulfur!)**
 - Phosphorous acid (Phosphonate): **Organic Lab. Exel LE**, **Monterey Agri-Fos** (Do not mix it with a copper fungicide)
 - Potassium bicarbonate (similar to baking soda): **Monterey Bi-Carb old fashioned fungicide**
 - Sulfur: **Bonide Sulfur Plant Fungicide (note: do not mix with oil! Also, some varieties are sensitive to sulfur)**
- **Some of over-the-counter products contain other pesticides such as an insecticide, which you may or may not need. Please make sure to read the label.**
